DANGER SIGNS

If a child has any of these signs he or she might die and needs to be taken immediately to the nearest health facility

DANGER SIGNS

Convulsions or fits now or within the past 2 days

Coma / Loss of consciousness

Patient is confused or very sleepy - cannot be woken

Extreme weakness - unable to stand or sit without support

Very Hot – with temperature of 38.5 °C or more

Very Cold –with temperature of 35.0 °C or less

Vomiting everything - cannot keep down food or drink

Not able to drink or breastfeed

Severe anaemia - very pale palms, fingernails, eyelids

Yellow eyes

Difficulty in breathing

Severe dehydration - sunken eyes, sunken fontanelle, skin pinch, coated tongue

What to do if a child has any of these danger signs:

- 1. Check blood using Quick Malaria Test
- If test is:
 POSITIVE Treat child with Antimalarial Suppository (Rectal Artesunate)
 NEGATIVE - Do <u>not</u> give any medicine; refer to health unit for treatment instead
- 3. Write Emergency Referral Form use RED FORM
- 4. Instruct caretaker to take child to the nearest health unit immediately without delay

Any illness in a young baby less than 2 months old:

A young baby can quickly become dangerously sick.

Refer baby without delay to the nearest health facility – use RED FORM

DO <u>NOT</u> GIVE RECTAL ARTESUNATE or any other medicine as this may not be safe in a baby
